Yamaha offers beginning music courses for many age groups, but the Junior Music Course is the cornerstone of the Yamaha Music Education System. This two-year curriculum was designed for four- and five-year-old students. Lessons are taught in groups, with parents or caregivers attending the classes. Children sing solfège, play the keyboard, sing songs, move to music, and play in both rhythm and keyboard ensembles. Typically, children hear a melody or harmony, sing it with solfège, play it on the keyboard and then learn to read it. This, in turn, sets the stage for improvisation and composition. Music appreciation activities are also an important part of classes.

Only teachers who are sponsored by authorized Yamaha Music Schools can enter the teacher training process. After prospective teachers pass an entrance examination, they attend seminars locally and at the Yamaha Corporation headquarters in southern California.
