COMBINED PAYMENT/MAKEUP LESSON POLICY STATEMENT

Payment for lessons will be make on a monthly basis. Payment for each month is due the week prior to the new month. (Example: June lesson payment is due the last week of May.)

Considering your time and level of training, any musician who tries to make a full time living at teaching should set fees that will produce AT LEAST \$40,000 A YEAR, AFTER EXPENSES and payment of health insurance and social security taxes and other self employment taxes. For the experienced teacher the sky is the limit. Those who don't teach for a living should not undercut their fees and should charge the same rate as the professional teacher. You should not (for the love for your fellow musician) drive the wages down for those who are trying to make a living at it.
